DCC works towards skilled volunteering, with volunteers aged 21 to 75 years old. They choose to depart for 3 to 6 months (renewable) to put their professional experience at the service of the local partner and to **experience fraternity among peoples.**

Exchanges and commitments between the local partner, the volunteer, and DCC

The local partner

- Proposes a clearly defined mission for promoting human development.
- Welcomes the volunteer upon arrival and introduces them to the local team.
- Supports the volunteer on a daily basis in their mission and conducts regular evaluation sessions.
- Covers the volunteer's food and accommodation throughout the mission.
- Assists the volunteer with administrative procedures upon arrival and covers any residence permit fees during the volunteering period.

DCC

- Manages the entire volunteer recruitment process: phone and in-person interviews during the "Choosing" session.
- Prepares volunteers for departure during the 7-day "Leaving" training: intensive preparation on volunteering-related topics such as health, safety, local integration, conflict management, spirituality, context of the area, societies, and cultures.
- Provides social protection for volunteers: CFE social security, health insurance, medical repatriation, and private liability insurance.
- Supports volunteers remotely throughout the mission duration, via phone, email, and requests activity reports from volunteers.
- Offers spiritual, psychological support, and professional coaching upon the volunteer's request.
- Conducts an annual field visit to meet partners and volunteers.
- Supports volunteers upon their return from the mission, in their social and professional reintegration.

The volunteer

- Puts their professional skills at the service of the local partner with an emphasis on exchanging practices and respecting local dynamics.
- Experiences intercultural encounters and acts of fraternity.
