Founded in 1967, the Catholic Delegation for Cooperation (DCC) is the international volunteering service of the Church in France. As a development NGO, it accompanies nearly 400 volunteers each year in 40 countries around the world.



Volunteering with DCC

>> At the request of its local partners

Through solidarity volunteering, the DCC supports the development projects of its local partners among the poorest populations. Together, they assess the relevance and feasibility of the projects, as well as collaborations with local teams for sharing skills in a spirit of exchange and reciprocity.

>> Aiming for development

The DCC recruits and trains volunteers for the challenges of the mission to which they have been assigned based on their skills. They intervene in various areas: education, health, vocational training, project management, rural development, etc. The DCC supports them before departure and in the field by creating conditions for solidarity and brotherhood. DCC, volunteers, and partners join forces to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals.

>> Various statuses for various needs

The DCC accompanies volunteers on missions ranging from 3 months to 2 years.

- Volunteering for Exchanges and Skills (VEC) Short-term mission, from 3 to 6 months, outside of France, or remotely,
- International Solidarity Volunteering (VSI) from 1 to 2 years, renewable, outside of France, including South-South International Volunteering (VISS)
- International Reciprocity Volunteering (VIR) in France, for 10 months or 1 year. It is necessary to plan approximately 3 to 6 months between your written mission request and the arrival of the volunteer in the field. This is the time required to recruit, validate the mission, and provide training.

>> From "integral human development" to "integral ecology"

DCC embraces a vision of development rooted in the experience and social teachings of the Church. It guides all of its actions and places the human person at the heart of the concept of development. DCC implements integral development, which promotes the human being in its material, cultural, and religious dimensions. Open to all cultures and spiritualities, tolerance and diversity are the foundations of a better world for DCC.

Attentive to sustainable development, DCC works so that everyone can live with dignity on a habitable planet. Through volunteering, the aim is to respond to Pope Francis' call to promote "integral ecology".


>> Your commitments as a partner

Financially, you cover:


- Accommodation and meals
- Residence permit or long-term visa (if necessary)
- For VSI volunteers only: a monthly subsistence allowance adjusted to the cost of living (on average €150)
- For VSI volunteers only: round-trip plane ticket
